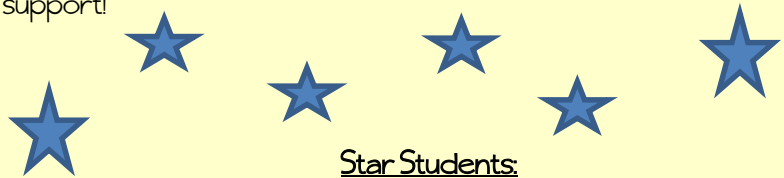
Happy Leap Year!
